Subject: Global Alternative Method of Compliance (AMOC) Request for AD 2020-18-01

Dear Mr. Mordasiewicz:

The Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) has received your proposal via Reference 1, dated October 8, 2020, proposing an alternative method of compliance (AMOC) to Airworthiness Directive (AD) 2020-18-01 paragraph (i)(1).

The Wichita ACO Branch approves your AMOC proposal to paragraph (i)(1) of AD 2020-18-01 to permit the installation of Hutch Aviation Parts Manufacturer Approval (PMA) parts in lieu of the Textron Aviation parts for select Cessna model 172, 182, 210-5 (205), 206, and 207 airplanes. Hutch Aviation parts acceptable for installation are identified via PMA

Number PQ3838SW, Supplement Number 4, dated November 7, 2019 and PMA Number PQ3838SW, Supplement Number 5, dated May 11, 2020.

In accordance with FAA Order 8110.103B, dated September 14, 2016, the following conditions apply:

1. All provisions of AD 2020-18-01 that are not specifically referenced above remain fully applicable and must be complied with accordingly.
2. Installation of Hutch Aviation PMA parts in lieu of the Textron Aviation parts does not remove the initial and repetitive inspections required in AD 2020-18-01 paragraphs (g) and (h).
3. This approval is applicable only to Cessna model 172, 182, 210-5 (205), 206, and 207 airplanes identified in paragraph (c) of AD 2020-18-01.
4. This approval is based on the data provided via References 1 through 4.
5. This approval is transferable with the aircraft to an operator who operates the aircraft under U.S. registry.

Before using this AMOC, notify your appropriate principal inspector, or lacking a principal inspector, the manager of the local flight standards district office/certificate holding district office. It must be noted in the aircraft records that this AMOC was used to comply with the AD.
